WATER FILINGS MADE
TO IRRIGATE LAND

The precious fluid that is to make for the growing of great crops in the Rogue River Valley is still being put under control by those who will benefit from it. About every spring and rivulet is to be made to do service for the benefit of mankind. So get yours while the getting is the fashion. Here are some of the filings of late:

C. E. Woolfolk of Grants Pass, for .01 second foot of water from Gilbert creek for irrigating one acre. A dam of brush earth and a pumping plant will cost \$200; work to be commenced by November 1.

Geo. L. Allen, of Waldo filed in the office of the state engineer application for a permit to appropriate .05 second foot of water from Cedar Gulch, tributary to the east fork of Illinois river, for irrigating 4 acres of land. A dam of lumber, earth and rock, a timber headgate and a main ditch will be constructed at a cost of \$35, beginning June 5.

H. C. Muller of Grants Pass, R. F. D. No. 2 to take .62 second foot of water from Rogue River for irrigating 50 acres. The applicant will install a pipe line and flume $\frac{3}{4}$ mile long, and a pumping plant; all to cost \$1250. Work thereon will be commenced by July 1 next.

Frank Randler, of Jacksonville, to take .4 second foot of water from tributaries of Little Applegate river,

for irrigating 13 acres. Construction of a ditch 1 mile long will be started June 1; it is estimated to cost \$150.

W. F. Wilson of Murphy, for .3 second foot of water from Williams creek tributary to Applegate river, for irrigating 24 acres. Construction here will be principally the enlargement of Watts-Topping ditch, with an additional dam of brush and rock and a timber headgate; all to cost \$250; work to begin within one year.

Charles Stallworth, of Kerby, to take .2 second foot of water from the east fork of Illinois river for the irrigation of 30 acres. A pumping plant with two laterals from pump will be installed at a cost of \$500; work to be commenced by May 1, 1921.

B. M. and L. M. Clute, of Murphy, R. F. D. No. 1, to take .81 second foot of water from Applegate river, for the irrigation of 65 acres. A dam of logs, brush and straw, 2 feet high and 300 feet long, and the enlargement of the S. D. Cook ditch will cost \$1500; work to be commenced by November 1.

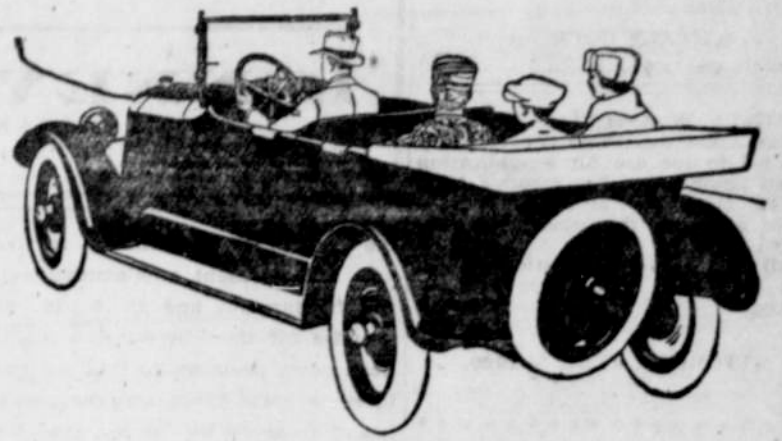
George T. Elsey of Merlin, to take .23 second foot of water from Laundry or Crow creek, tributary to Jump-off-Joe creek for irrigating 10 acres and for domestic supply. A dam of rock and cement, 8 feet high and 25 feet long, with 120 feet of pipe line, will be installed at a cost of \$700; work to begin by September 1.

Ben and Frank McComber, of Merlin to take .12 second foot of water from the east fork of Yew Wood creek, a tributary of Rogue river, for irrigating 10 acres. The water will
