be pumped from the creek into a
pipe line or ditch; cost, \$500; work
will be commenced before March 1,
1921.

G. B. Fossati, of Wolf Creek, Jose-
phine county, to take .08 second foot
of water from Wolf creek, tributary
to Grave creek, for irrigating 6
acres. A dam of logs and brush, and
a timber headgate will be construct-
ed at a cost of \$100; work to be
commenced by March 1, 1921.
