Clara de Varilla of 1095 Valencia St., San Francisco, is the mother of the "red-headed corporal," as de Varilla was called in the army, and the funeral took place at her home. Interment was made at Cypress Lawn cemetery and military escort was furnished by the army post at the Presidio.
