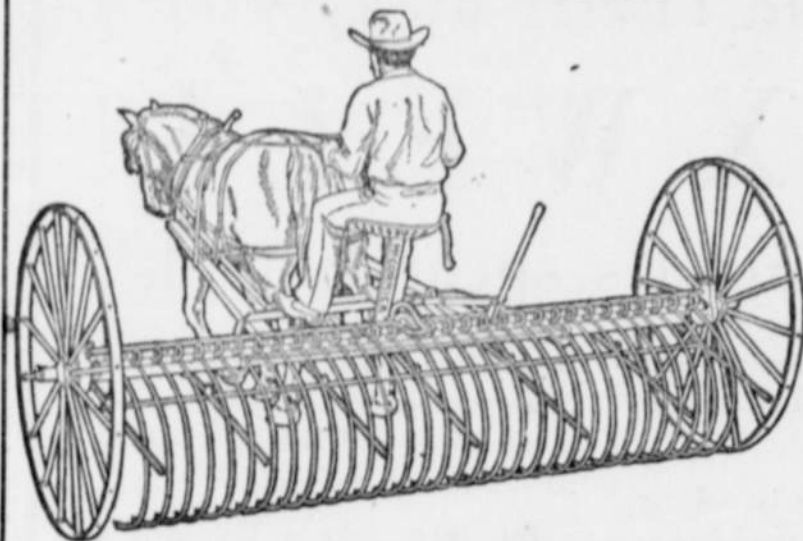

The following statement is issued by Collector of Internal Revenue Milton A. Miller: "In this, as in every other section of the country, there will be conducted during the next two months an extensive tax drive for the collection of delinquent sales and other miscellaneous taxes, such as the so-called luxury tax, the soft drink tax, the admission tax, the manufacturer's tax, the tax on jewelry and works of art, and the

tax on toilet articles and proprietary medicines. Reports of laxity on the part of the dealers and other persons responsible for the return and collection of these taxes have reached the bureau of internal revenue from many sources."
