Sealed proposals will be received by the Board of Directors of The Grants Pass Irrigation District at their office in the Courthouse, Grants Pass, Oregon, until 11 a. m., June 26, 1920, for the construction of: A hollow concrete dam, power house and machinery, fishway and canal intake, involving approximately 8800 cu. yds. of excavation and 4950 cu. yds. of concrete; 31 miles of canals and laterals, involving approximately 425,000 cu. yds. of excavation; 2500 lineal feet of wooden flumes, the laying of about 7000 lineal feet of riveted steel pipe; and bridges, turnouts, and other structures.
