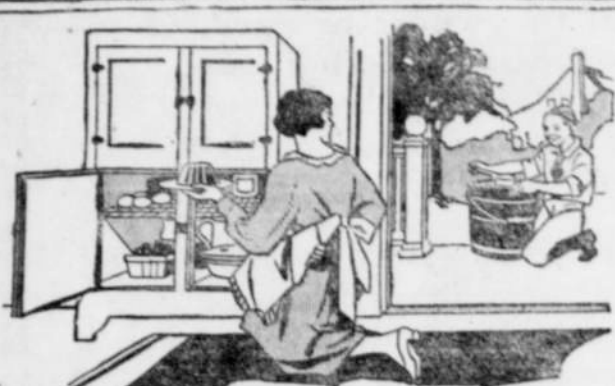

SOUTH CANAL BEING TESTED FULL LENGTH

Late this afternoon Alvah Gunnell was seen hastening westward in a rush with a pair of gum boots in one hand and a brand new shovel in the other. He had received a hurry up call from the hop ranch that the water was on the way and that at last irrigation was in sight.

The concrete crossings under the Crescent City highway were completed last night and this morning the water was turned down the canal for the first time past the highway and made its way to the thirsty lands west. Not the full capacity of the pump was turned into the main canal this morning, the laterals to the east being served also till the canal had been tested out its full length. Other laterals are being made ready for use, and the land owners down Park street and in River Heights subdivision can have water within a few days. All the pumps will now be run night and day.
