NEW LAWS IN THE MAKING
Petitions are being circulated in Grants Pass to place the market commission bill and the divided session amendment on the ballot for the November elections. Both measures are being initiated by the state taxpayers league, and are designed as a constructive means of combating the non-partisan league, according to

those who are furthering the legislation.
The market commission bill is patterned after a similar act now in force in California and provides in substance leadership for the producers in marketing their products. The act will establish a market director, with authority to aid, foster and encourage the establishment of cooperative producers associations, furnish data on supply and demand, locate markets for Oregon products and act as mediator in all disputes between producers, distributors and consumers.
The divided sessions amendment is being advocated to do away with the present system which allows the majority of measures to be jammed through the legislature during the closing days of the session. It has the backing of the conservative interests in that it will furnish protection against radical legislation through the publicity that all bills will get during the 60-day interval between sessions and before final

ratification of the measures at the last session.
It provides for an opening session of 40 days, an adjournment of 60 days and then a closing session of 10 days. No new bills can be introduced at the last session not even by unanimous consent. All that is done at the second session is to re-pass or ratify acts passed at the first session.
The conservative interests urge support for the measure because of the fact that it is now conceded that the non-partisans will have a strong minority at the next legislature. It is argued that radical or socialistic bills which are sure to be introduced will meet defeat through the publicity they are sure to gain.
