nent Roseburg hotel making settlement of her bill for accommodations at the hostelry. A group of tourists just ahead of her, after settlement with the clerk, asked as to accommodations at points south of Roseburg, and the clerk, from reasons that no doubt were sufficient for him whether based upon truth or not, advised that Grants Pass should be passed up, "there being no adequate hotel accommodation there," and a third rate hotel at Medford was recommended.

The kick-back in such action as that of the clerk at the hotel at Roseburg will cost the city of Roseburg much more than the grasping clerk can possibly hope to profit. The tourist will find disappointment when

he stops at the place recommended in Medford, for there are better places in the Jackson county metropolis than the antiquated house which he suggested. He will also learn that in Grants Pass there are hotels that can meet his needs equally as well as can any in Southern Oregon. The citizens of Grants Pass will resent the discrimination against this community by citizens of Roseburg, and the pleasant relations that have existed heretofore will be endangered. The Roseburg clerk knows that Grants Pass can offer the very best of hotel accommodation for the tourist, and his discrimination must have an ulterior motive. He knows that the tourist has not seen Oregon unless he stops at all of these beautiful Southern Oregon cities—Roseburg, Grants Pass, Medford, Ashland—and discrimination by the one against the other is against the entire district. If Roseburg is wise she will throttle that officious clerk at the Umpqua hotel.

Reports come from the mouth of the Rogue of fishermen fighting to see which will get the best position below the "dead line" marked out by state law. Then the residents of Gold Beach wonder why the upper river people want a closed river!

Also isn't it rather funny that the Medford "sports" would line themselves up with a bunch that countenances the illegal fishing. But of course anything goes that will help to keep a dollar away from Grants Pass that Medford can't get.
