In the matter of the organization of an Irrigation District.

Notice is hereby given by the undersigned petitioners, whose names are subscribed to the following and attached petition, and who are a majority of the bona fide owners of land within the boundaries of the irrigation district proposed and described in the attached petition, irrigated of susceptible of irrigation that said petitioners by said attached petition propose the organization of an irrigation district under the provisions of Chapter 357, General Laws of Oregon for 1917, and acts amendatory thereof, with the boundaries more particularly described and set forth in said attached petition, and will present the said petition, here-to attached, to the county Court of Josephine County, Oregon, for its consideration, for the purpose of organizing such irrigation district, under the provisions of said laws, at a special meeting of said court called for the purpose of considering and acting upon said petition on Saturday, the 24th day of July, 1920, at the hour of 10 o'clock in the forenoon of said day, or as soon thereafter as the Court can attend to and hear the same, at the courtroom of said Court, in the County Courthouse, Grants Pass, Josephine County, Oregon.

This notice is published pursuant to said laws once each week for four successive weeks, and the date of the first publication hereof is the 21st day of June, 1920.

Said petition is as follows, to-wit: PETITION FOR ORGANIZATION OF AN IRRIGATION DISTRICT

In the matter of the Organization of an Irrigation District under Chapter 357, General Laws of Oregon for 1917, and acts amendatory thereof.

To the County Court of Josephine County, Oregon, and to the Honorable C. G. Gillette, County Judge of said Court and County, and to W. F. McCabe and J. S. McFadden, commissioners of said court and county:

We, the undersigned petitioners, owners of land within the boundaries of the proposed irrigation district, hereinafter described, being desirous of providing for the construction of an irrigation system and works, for the irrigation of the lands within said boundaries, susceptible of irrigation, do hereby propose the organization of an irrigation district under and in accordance with the provisions of an act of the twenty-ninth legislative session of Oregon at the regular assembly of said assembly, providing for the organization of irrigation districts, as set forth and contained

in Chapter 357, of the General Laws of Oregon for 1917, and under and in accordance with all acts amendatory thereof, and do respectfully petition for the organization of such irrigation district, and state and represent as follows:

That a majority of the bona fide owners of lands within the boundaries of the Irrigation District, as herein proposed, irrigated or susceptible of irrigation, have signed this petition, and hereby request the organization of such irrigation district.

That each of the signers of this petition is a bona fide owner of one acre or more of land situate within the boundaries hereinafter described of the said proposed irrigation district, and over the age of twenty-one years, and each of said signers is qualified in all respects under the law to petition for the organization of such irrigation district.

That the boundaries of said irrigation district as proposed by your petitioners are described particularly as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point on the North bank of Rogue River where a slough or lake sometimes known as Vannoy Creek empties into said Rogue River, in Section 20, Township 36 South, Range 6 West, Willamette Meridian; thence running in a North-easterly direction along the center of said slough or lake to a point where the section line between sections 16 and 17, said township and range, crosses said slough or lake, which is about 1589 feet South of the quarter corner between said section 16 and said section 17; thence North along said section line to the Northwest corner of said Section 16; thence East along the North lines of Section 16, Section 15, and Section 14, said township and range, to a point on the North line of said Section 14, said township and range, nineteen rods and eleven and one-half feet East from the Northwest corner of Lot 10 in said section 14, said point being the Northeast corner of a tract of land described in a deed recorded on December 17, 1918, at page 335, Volume 50, Deed Records of Josephine County, Oregon, from Roy E. Lathrop and wife, and Carl M. Lathrop to Mrs. C. M. Lathrop; thence South 44 rods; thence West 19 rods 11 1/2 feet; thence South to the North boundary line of the James P. and Margaret Tufts Donation Land Claim Number 37; thence West along the North boundary line of said Donation Land Claim Number 37 to the Northwest corner of said donation land claim; in Section 14, said Township and Range; thence South along the West boundary line of said Donation Land Claim Number 37, to a point on said West line 550 feet South of the Northwest corner of said Donation Land Claim; thence South 72 degrees 9 minutes east 130.36 feet; thence South 79 degrees 39 minutes east 400 feet; thence South 72 degrees 55 minutes east 469.53 feet; thence south 138.1 feet to center of County Road; thence along center of County Road North 74 degrees 30 minutes West 84.11 feet; thence North 78 degrees 15 minutes West 300 feet; thence North 79 degrees 33 minutes West 597 feet to a point in the center of said County Road 1966 feet South of Northwest corner of said Donation Land Claim Number 37; thence South to Rogue River; thence westerly along the meander line of Rogue River to the point of beginning, all in Josephine County, State of Oregon. That the lands within the above described boundaries are wholly within Josephine County, Oregon, and your petitioners, desire to provide for the construction of an irrigation system and irrigation works for the irrigation of the lands within said boundaries susceptible of irrigation.

That it is the purpose and desire of your petitioners to organize an irrigation district under the provisions of said act and acts amendatory thereof, and to that end we have signed this petition.

WHEREFORE Your petitioners pray that a hearing be had upon this petition; that on final hearing thereof, by order of said County Court, an election be held within said proposed irrigation district, according to the provisions of said act for the purpose of determining whether or not such proposed irrigation district shall be organized; and such proceedings be had in the matter of the organization of such irrigation district as are required by law; and that such irrigation district be organized and its boundaries established and defined, under the provisions of said act and acts amendatory thereof.
