NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that there have been filed with the Board of Directors of The Grants Pass Irrigation District situated in Josephine and Jackson Counties, State of Oregon, the petitions of the holders of title or evidence of title representing individual tracts of land adjacent to the boundaries of The Grants Pass Irrigation District and situated entirely in Josephine County, State of Oregon, which lands have not heretofore been included within the boundaries of The Grants Pass Irrigation District; the individual petitioners and the tracts which they petition for inclusion within the boundaries of The Grants Pass Irrigation District being as follows, to-wit:

George Milleson: The West five (5) acres of the southwest 1/4 of the southeast 1/4, and the East fifteen (15) acres of the southeast 1/4 of the southwest 1/4 of Section 13, Twp. 36, South, Range 6 West of Willamette Meridian, being 20 acres in all.

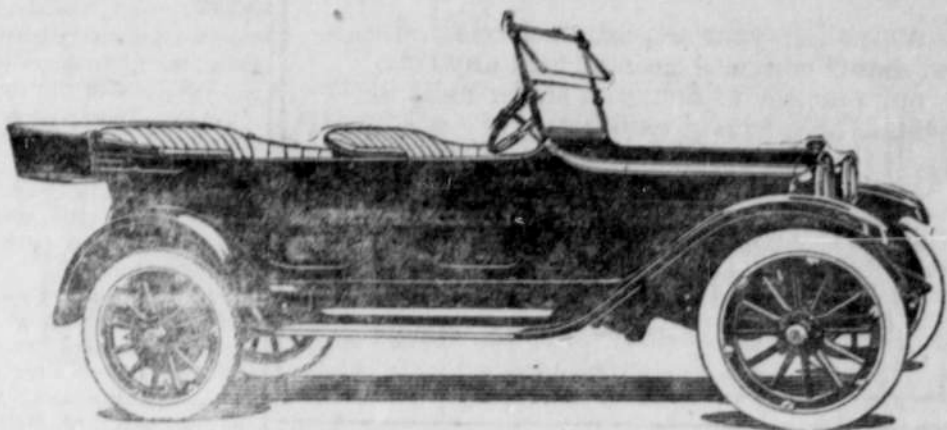
