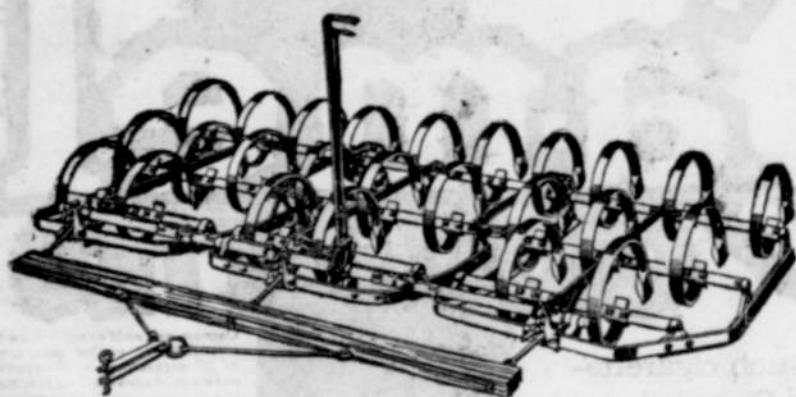

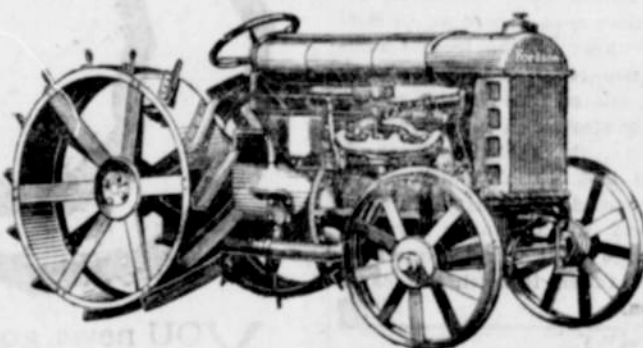

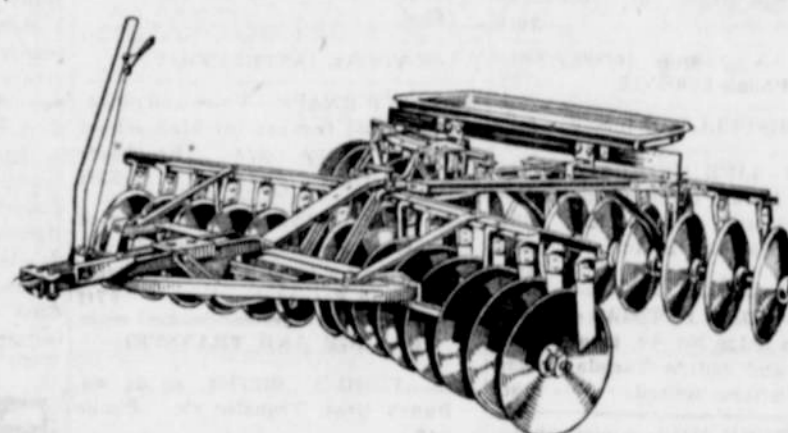

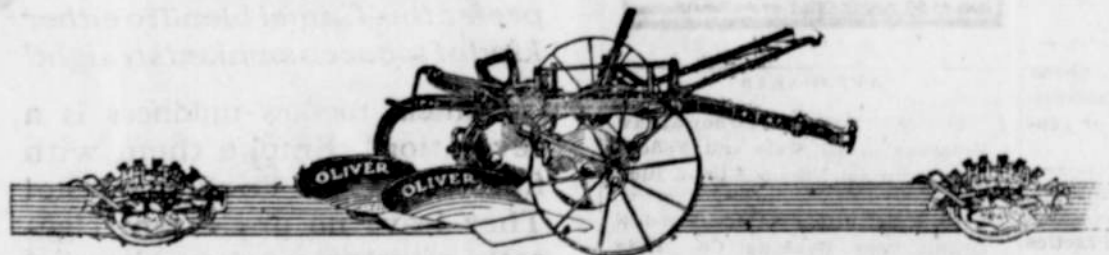
SPRING TOOTH HARROW CUTS CLEAN, LEAVES SOIL IN PERFECT CONDITION



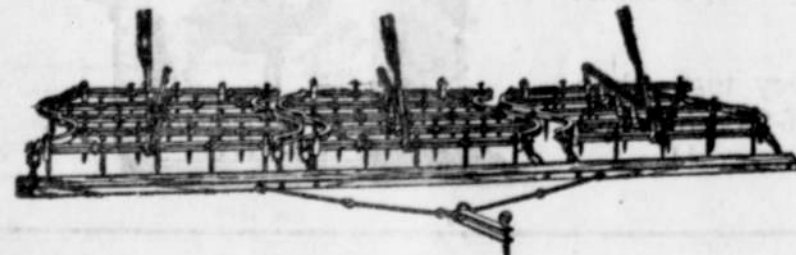

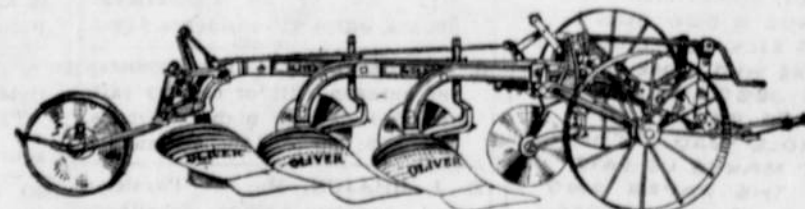

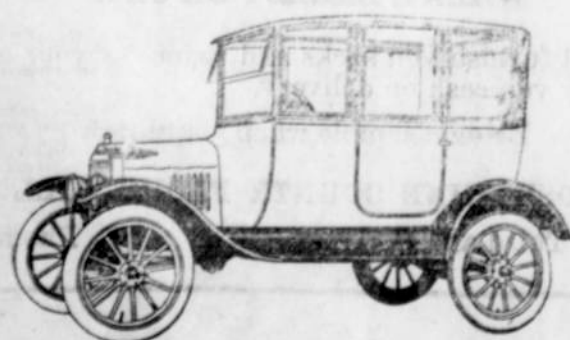
LEVERS WITHIN REACH OF TRACTOR DRIVER. THIS PLOW CUTS A GOOD CLEAN FURROW.
