During the war period there was a movement of the population of the country toward the larger centers where war industries called for the activities of every able bodied man who was not fitted for war service. Young men, those on whom fell the brunt of the war-making game, were called to the colors, while ship building plants called their thousands.

Men and women were also drafted into the cause to fill the places in office or mercantile establishment made vacant by enlistments. This naturally called from the inland points many families, with a temporary decrease in population. With the adjustment of business conditions following the closing of the war these people are coming back, the population of the interior points is again becoming normal. This is the chief reason why the census taken last January shows a falling off in the interior in the majority of cases. A census taken now would tell a different story, and Medford is taking a new census through the enterprise of the community to prove that the loss shown by the federal census was not a real loss. There is one source of loss of population in all agricultural communities that has become real, and that is the loss of many young men and women who left during the war per-

iod, and who have now taken up new vocations rather than to return to the old.

The report from the census bureau shows that Josephine county suffered in common with other communities that were isolated from the centers of war industry and war activity, and this is reflected in the census report. This report gives Josephine a population of 7655, an apparent loss of about 20 per cent. That it is not a real loss, and that it has now been more than made good, is evidenced by the fact that there are not houses enough for the people who wish to make their homes here. There was never a time when real and substantial industrial growth was

more apparent than now. New business blocks are springing up and the older and out-of-date structures are giving way to the modern. And despite the census report, the most pressing need of the day is new homes for the people who would live here. That is the next problem for solution by the community.
