IN THE MATTER OF LIMITING THE CAPACITY OF LOADS PASSING OVER THE PAVED ROADS OF JOSEPHINE COUNTY, OREGON.

In the County Court of the State of Oregon for Josephine County NOW at this time comes on for consideration the above entitled matter, and it appearing to the Court that owing to heavy loaded trucks, the paved highways in Josephine county, Oregon, are being damaged by such loads;

And it further appearing that the State Highway Commission of the State of Oregon, and the County Court of Josephine County, Oregon, having heretofore entered into a contract whereby the Pacific highway and other improved roads in Josephine county, Oregon, are to be maintained on a 50-50 basis;

And it further appearing that the State Highway Commission has demanded that the loads on paved roads in Josephine County, Oregon, be limited in order to protect the paving, which has already been laid, and which may hereafter be laid on the State Highway in Josephine County, Oregon;

And it further appearing to the Court that it is to the best interest of the County that an Order be made limiting the loads on all paved highways within Josephine County, Oregon, in order that the State Highway Commission may be required to pay their portion for the maintenance of said highways in Josephine County, Oregon, as agreed to and as hereinbefore mentioned; and the Court being fully advised in the premises;

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, That the maximum capacity load for any vehicle passing over any paved highway within Josephine County, Oregon, exclusive of the weight of said vehicle, be, and the same is hereby fixed at 10,000 pounds;

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that no loads shall pass over any paved highway in Josephine County, Oregon, wherein the weight on any wheel shall exceed 600 pounds to the inch width of tire on any vehicle.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That the Sheriff of Josephine County, Oregon, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to employ such assistance and equipment as may be necessary for him to assist the public in ascertaining the weight and capacity of their respective vehicle.
