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The surface waters of the ocean are in constant motion under the influence of waves, tides, currents and drifts. Waves are vertical oscillations caused by the winds. Tides resemble waves in their motion, but they owe their origin to the attractive force of the sun and moon. The horizontal movements of the surface waters are known as drifts and currents. A drift is a general movement under the influence of the wind, but slower and more changeable in direction than a current. Included seas have a circulatory movement because the water usually differs in density from the ocean.

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
