Game Wardens Ed Walker and Pat Dailey have received a wire which states that the federal migratory bird act closes the season on doves for 19 years and supersedes and destroys the Oregon law which says the dove season opens September 1st. The local game wardens will strictly enforce this law. The open season which begins September 1st is on deer and gray squirrels.
