GERMANS FIND WAY TO MAKE DIAMONDS

Amsterdam, Nov. 16.—(A. P.)—Henry Polak, president of the Dutch Diamond Workers' Union, says it is not impossible that a German explosives' firm has discovered how to manufacture diamonds artificially, as it claims to have done. The chief difficulty is to obtain an unbelievably powerful pressure under the right circumstances, M. Polak explained. Since it is a manufacturer of explosives which is reported to have discovered the method of making diamonds, he said it was possible that

experimenters had succeeded in obtaining the desired pressure.

M. Polak expressed some doubt as to whether diamonds could be manufactured artificially at less than the cost of mining them.

It was recently announced in Berlin that a dynamite company of Hamburg had obtained the patent for the manufacture of diamonds and was in a position to produce several hundred carats daily at a cost less than the present world price for the natural stones.

SWINE DURING HOT WEATHER

Fattening Pigs Will Not Suffer From Heat If Given Plenty of Water and Ample Shade.

Fattening pigs require some attention in hot weather, but usually pigs weighing 100 to 150 pounds or more will not suffer from the heat or die if given plenty of cool water and protection from the sun. A concrete hog wallow is quite sanitary and if built in the overhead from a spring it keeps clear with the inflow of clean water. On hot days pigs will lie on the concrete feeding floor in the hog barn during the heat of the day and forage in the rape during the cool of the morning and evening.

LIVE STOCK NOTES
