ROGUE VALLEY "MISTLAND" FRUIT

The Oregon Growers Association is a great organization. Its foundation seems to be built upon solid rock and its cooperative effort will bring profit to the fruit growers of the state just as like organizations have brought profit and wealth to the growers of California. As a trade mark showing affiliation with the association, enameled signs bearing the legend, "This is a Mistland Orchard," will be supplied each member for display over the entrance to the orchard, and the products of these orchards will go to the markets under the brand "Mistland."

C. I. Lewis of the association has been working on the signs that will not only be attractive from an artistic standpoint, but will be so colored that the wording may be easily read by passing tourists, as well as by the home folks.

The signs are to be about 15 by 20 inches painted on enamel, in order to make them weather proof and attractive enough in colors to make them easily noticed. It is probable that the background will be black, with a large triangle covering the most of the sign in a triangle in an orange color. Over this orange and black will be lettering in white, that can be easily read.

Incidentally, with the Mistland sign over the entrance to an orchard, the owner thereof will be doing his part of advertising Mistland products and letting the world know that he is a member of the Oregon Growers Cooperative Association.

There is only one bad feature about that brand. It of course indicates that the fruit comes from the land of the Oregon mist, but does it

That is what is going to make a Rogue valley brand of "Mistland" fruit that is just a little better than the straight article.

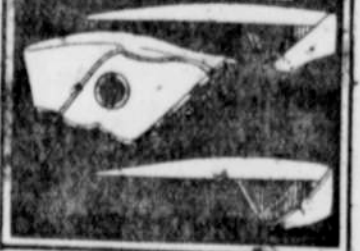
