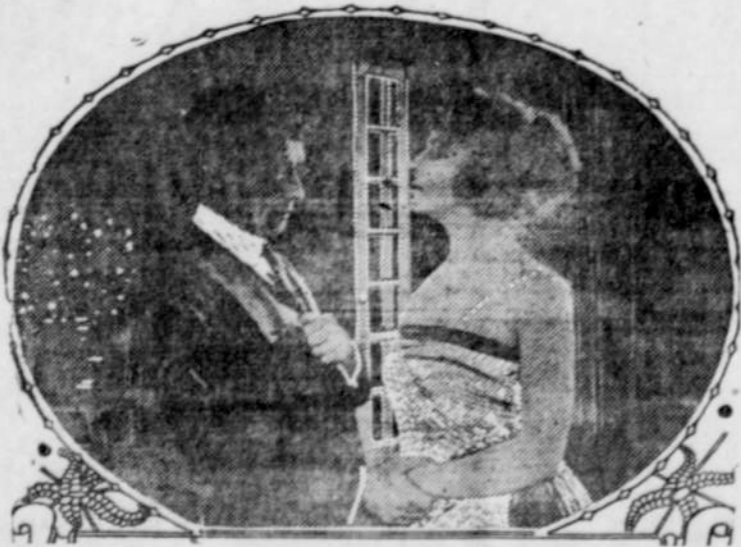

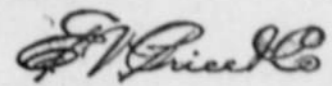
Elks Will Dance—
