It shows the three men as they appeared immediately after being hanged, the picture being a flashlight.

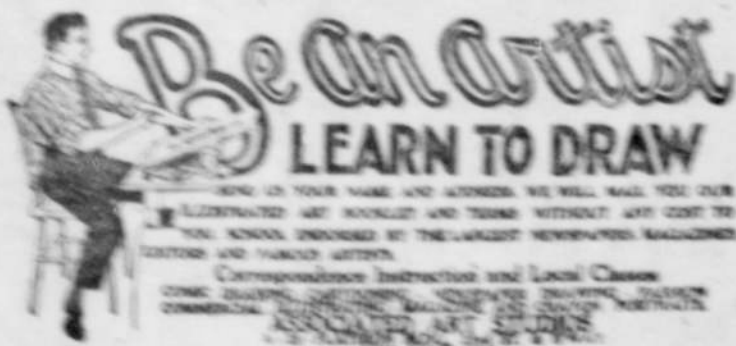
