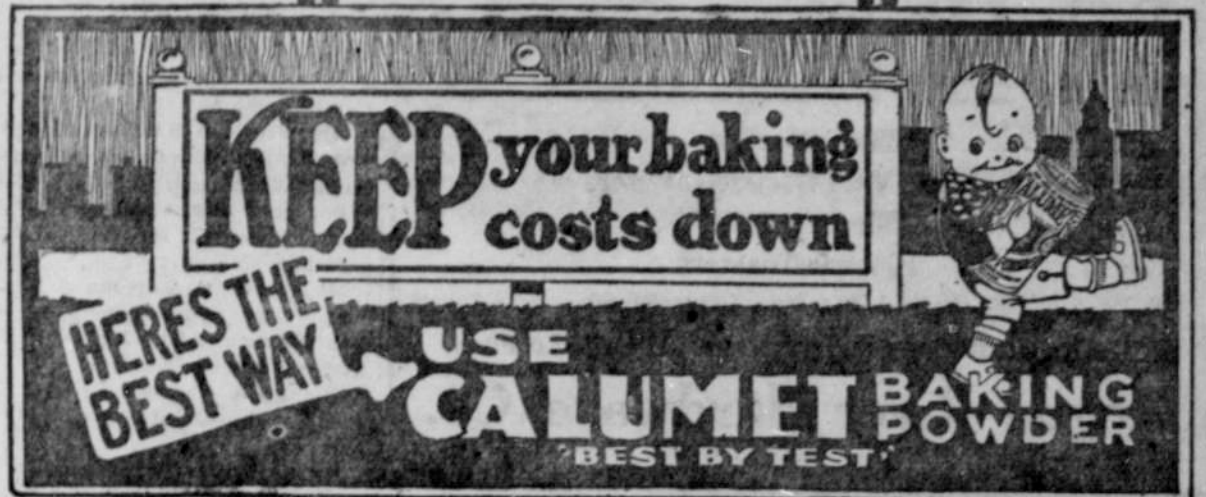
Unmasculine.
