Best of All Holidays

TAKING it all in all, it may be safely asserted that Christmas is the merriest and the best of all holidays, and one which is likely to be observed for ages yet to come. Nations may rise and fall, new beliefs and religions may sweep away the old, but that would seem, indeed, a dreary and empty year which brought no merry Christmas in its annual round. An Ancient Christmas Dish.

An indispensable Christmas dish of ancient times was "frumentum" or "frumante." Here is the recipe for making the dish according to a faithful old chronicler: "Take clean wheat and bray it in a mortar until the hulls be all gone off, and seethe it until it burst, and take it up and let it cool; and take clean, fresh broth and sweet milk of almonds or sweet milk of kine and temper it all; and take the yolks of eggs. Boil it a little and set it down and mess it forth with fat venison or fresh mutton." Frumentum was often served alone without venison or mutton. When served by itself it was well sweetened.

Cement Impaired by Age.

In a test of the effects of age on cement, keeping more than a year seemed to cause impairment, and cement that had been stored more than two years showed about the same strength as fresh cement only when the sand and gravel in a concrete mixture were reduced about 25 per cent. Mixing the old cement with a 5 per cent calcium chloride solution instead of water greatly increased the strength.

Sun Halos.

Halos around the sun are good weather signs, and many weather prophets based upon the observation of halos are founded upon sound scientific principles, according to a writer in the Scientific American. Studies of the relation of halos to rainfall show that during the summer months 50 to 60 per cent of all halos are followed by rain within 36 hours. During the winter months 70 to 75 per cent are so followed. Precipitation follows sooner in winter than in summer because storms move more rapidly then.
