WHERE NO GUESSWORK GOES

A good many people who formerly made a wild guess at what their annual income might be, and were satisfied if there was not too wide a divergence in income and outgo, now have to do more than guess when Uncle Sam begins to question.

Every single person whose net income for 1920 was \$1,000 or more and every married person whose net income was \$2,000 or more is required to file a return under oath with the collector of internal revenue for the district in which he lives on or before March 15, 1921.

not more than \$1,000 and an additional assessment of 25 per cent of the amount of tax due. For willful refusal to make a return the penalty is a fine of not more than \$10,000 or not exceeding one year's imprisonment, or both together with the costs of prosecution.

The income tax applies to women as well as men. Husband and wife must consider the income of both plus that of minor dependent children and if the total equals or exceeds \$2,000 a return must be filed.

The normal tax rate for 1920 is the same as for 1919—4 per cent on the first \$4,000 of net income above the exemption and 8 per cent on the remaining net income.

HUNT FOR RARE STAMPS GOES ON

War Did Not Interfere With Work of Collectors.

FRENCH DEALER AN ENIGMA

His Acquaintance Must Be Cultivated Before He Can Be Prevailed Upon to Show His Stock—Americans on Military Duty in Paris Kept Up Their Search for Rarities—Early United States Issues Are Scarce in Europe, Says Prominent American Philatelist.

Some interesting facts regarding the innocent pursuit of postage stamp collecting in Paris during the war period have just been related by Warren L. Babcock, president of the Detroit Philatelic society, who was on military duty in Paris during several months of the war, and in the summer of 1918 was in the command of Base hospital No. 6 at Bordeaux.

Mr. Babcock says that to an American the French stamp dealer is an enigma. When asked for United States stamps he is likely to answer, "None at all or very few."

In the September number of Scott's Monthly Journal Mr. Babcock tells something of the difficulties and successes in running down rare copies during the strenuous days of the war.

The thriving export trade just before the Civil war is responsible for the many fine examples of the 1857 issue, especially the 5 and 10 cents.

The five-cent, type I, is considered the scarcer, though I found twice as many as of type II. The 30 cent is seldom, and the 90 cent rarely seen in good used condition.

The glorious issue of 1809 comes next. The lower values were seldom seen in the shops but the 10 cent presented often, as did the 15 cent in both types.

The French shops are favorable fields for odd cancellations, sub-varieties such as the 10 cent, 1851-1857, recuts, and to a lesser degree, the reissues of 1875.
