EXTERMINATE THE "DIGGER"

Success in agriculture requires a constant vigilance. There is soil fertility to watch, for always taking from and returning nothing to a soil will sooner or later impoverish it to the point where a paying crop can not be obtained. Then there are various insects and fungus pests that must be guarded against, calling for spraying at the proper season and in the proper manner. When soils were new and costs low the farmer was prone to neglect many of these little things that reduced profits, but when profit is reduced to near the vanishing point the little leaks have to be stopped. Today in Josephine county there is a campaign on to rid the lands of the gray digger squirrel pest. This little animal destroys crops every year that would total thousands of dollars of value if allowed to go to the harvest. The gray digger can be absolutely controlled with cooperative effort. And

it is cooperative effort that is now being called for. Every land owner whether he tills his acres or not, must go after the digger. Otherwise his land becomes the breeding ground for the hordes that flock over the line and eat up the neighbor's crops. The battle is now on. Go after the digger this week. They are all doing it.

Big Pipe for Siphon

The big pipes for siphoning the water across a bad piece of ground in Dry Diggin's district of the Tokay canal, for the irrigation district, is now being delivered on the ground by trucks. The district has arranged for the purchase of the old Tokay canal through the Irrigation and Power company property near the Golden Drift dam, and as soon as the steam shovel reaches this ditch it will be put upon other work, this completing the Tokay canal from the Savage Rapids dam to Sixth street in Grants Pass. The extension from Sixth street westward is now being excavated by Wolke & Schroeder.

Pittsburghers Will Bore.

After having tried, for a number of years, to get over and around the hills surrounding their city, the residents of Pittsburgh have decided to strike at the heart of the difficulty and go through them. Accordingly tunneling operations have been gotten under way which, when completed, will result in a double-tube bore that will accommodate pedestrian, street car and vehicular traffic, says Popular Mechanics Magazine. The estimated cost of the undertaking is between \$2,000,000 and \$3,000,000, and it is expected that two years will be required for its completion. It establishes no precedent, as another bore, made several years ago, has given satisfactory service, although reserved for the use of street cars only.

more light cruisers and 47 fewer destroyers. Japan is, however, devoting herself to submarines and it is expected that by 1927 she will beat the United States in submarines to the number of 32.

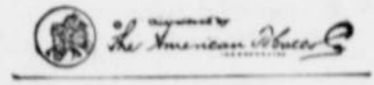
If the United States does not start a new program after 1923 (either replacing old ships transferred to the "second line" or augmenting her fleet) Japan, it is held here, after big expenditures and continuous building at her maximum capacity will in 1927 only be in practically the same relative position as she is today, 1921.

If, on the other hand, the United States after 1923 adopts a new building program of only replacing the ships going into the "second line," which is regarded as not only a reasonable assumption, but almost a certainty, then, it is the contention here that Japan in 1927, will occupy the same relatively weak position that she will have in 1923.
