### TO THE TAXPAYERS AND ELECTORS OF SCHOOL DISTRICT NUMBER SEVEN.

At its last session the Oregon Legislature changed existing laws relative to schools and education in a number of particulars.

Among the items of particular interest is the new law relative to the manner of nominating candidates for directors, the new law reads as follows:

The name of any qualified elector shall be placed on the ballot as a candidate for the office of school director upon filing with the clerk of the school district, at least seven days prior to the date of the election, of certificate of nomination, signed by not less than 3 per cent of the number, and in no case by less than ten persons, of the qualified electors voting for the office of school director at the last annual school election; provided, however, that there shall be filed with the clerk an acceptance of nomination by the nominee at least five days prior to the date of such

election, otherwise such nomination shall be void. It will thus be seen that any candidate desiring to be nominated to a place on the board of directors of school district Number Seven must file with the clerk of said district seven days prior to the date of the election, which is the 20th day of June, a certificate of nomination signed by not less than ten persons, qualified electors of the district, and the person so nominated must file with the said clerk an acceptance of nomination at least five days prior to the date of such election, otherwise such nomination shall be void. In other words the said certificate of nomination must be filed by the clerk on or before the 13th day of June, and the acceptance of the nomination on or before the 15th day of June, in order that said nomination may be valid. This explanation and notice is given in order that all the electors of the district may have ample time in which to be represented at the said election. EDWARD S. 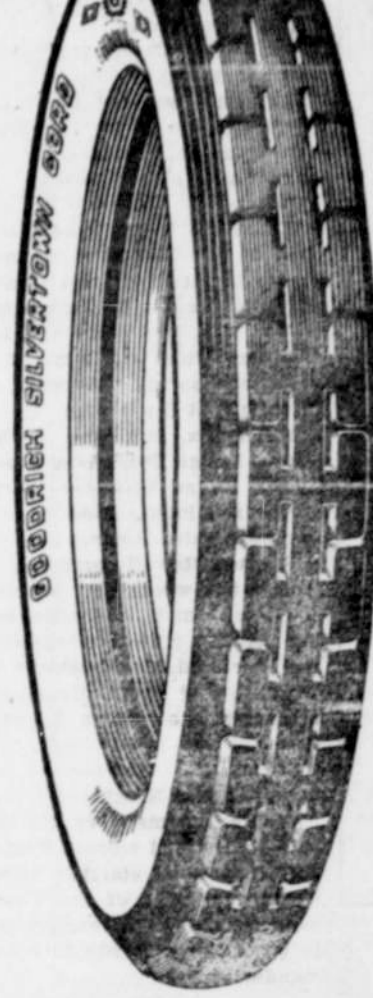
