SUCCESS CREATING SUCCESS
The highway commission now gives notice that it will award the contract next month for the paving of the 9.8 miles of the Pacific highway north of Grants Pass, thus closing the last gap in this district, and completing the paving throughout southern Oregon. This job will employ a large force of men during the season, increasing the local payroll and adding another factor to the advance of prosperity. This announcement brings to mind that old truth which says that success creates success. Grants Pass is the center of a revival of industrial activity not excelled by any community in Oregon. The various activities that will be under way during the summer represent work of more than a million dollars of value. The completion of the irrigation project will employ an average of nearly 15 men, while the two big road-building jobs, the paving north of town and the construction of the highway to the caves, will put scores of men on the payroll. It is payroll that counts, and while each of the three items noted will come to completion during the year, each will leave behind development that will yield returns for all time to come.

The irrigation project is a permanent asset, and some day, when final payment has been made upon the cost, there will belong to every acre of land under the canals a right more valuable than the land itself. So long as farming is carried on, the water will flow without cost to the user other than a maintenance charge that will be a pittance as compared with its worth. It will bring thousands of people here and will increase the homes by many fold. And so with the highways; once constructed, they also become a permanent asset to the community, aiding in development of the lands, in marketing the timber and in exploiting and developing the mines.

The merchants of a western Oregon town developed a plan of offering certain of their wares at a saving to the purchaser that attracts many people to the city. Forty-one of the merchants selected some one or more articles from their stocks and placed them on sale on a definite date at a most attractive saving to the buying public. Thus all the merchants were offering inducements to trade upon the day and the shopper could inspect 41 different lines of trade and find bargains in each. They would also find other bargains, for it is not always necessary that prices be cut to produce a bargain. But the cooperation of 41 houses produced a bargain day that caught public attention. It is a plan that any community might well adopt with profit.
