### MOTHERHOOD ENDOWMENT IS APPROVED IN N. SOUTH WALES

Sydney, N. S. W., June 17.—(A. P.)—The parliamentary labor party here has approved a draft of a bill providing endowment for motherhood.

Provision is made in the bill for a pension of about \$2.50 a week to widowed mothers up to an age provided for by the commonwealth. Parents in receipt of an income of \$45.50 will receive an endowment of \$1.50 for each child under 14 years of age after the first two.

The bill applies to persons resident in New South Wales two years or more.

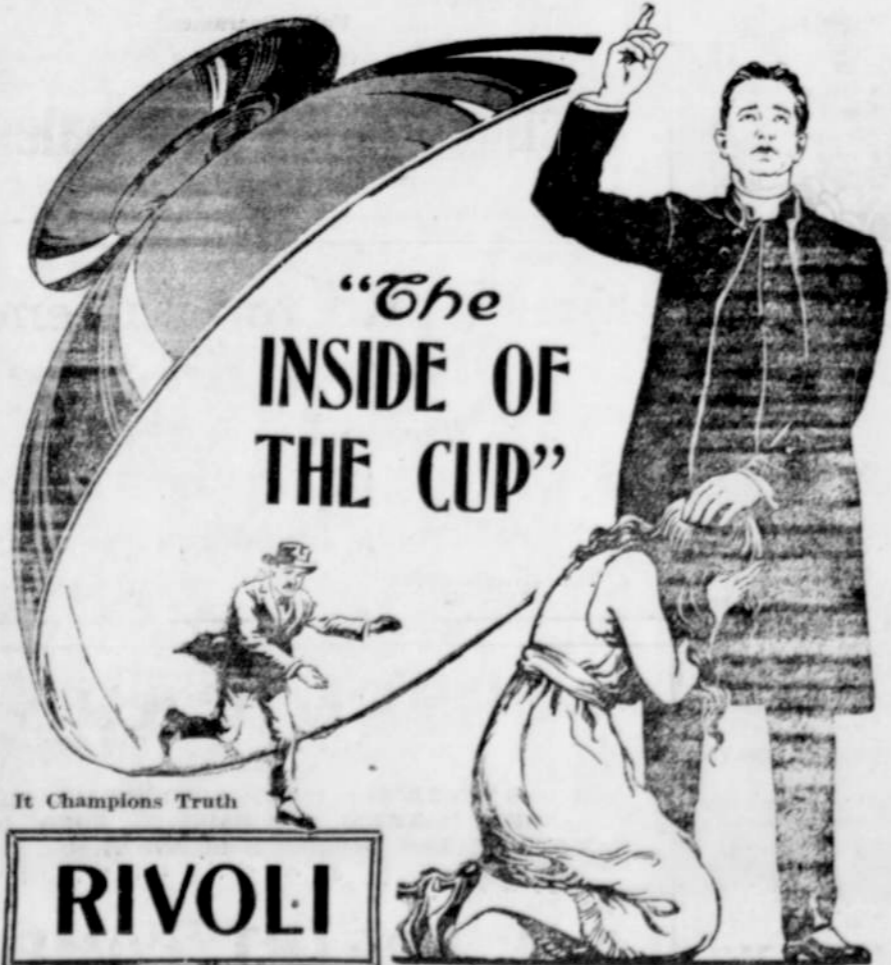
The scheme is estimated to cost 1,600,000 pounds annually.
