OREGON WEATHER
Tonight and Saturday, gen-
erally cloudy, probably thunder
storms in the mountains in the
east portion. Moderate south-
westerly winds.

THE HIGHWAY NORTH
The paving of the ten-mile stretch
of the Pacific highway north of the
city of Grants Pass, contract for
which will be let within the next few
days by the state highway commis-
sion calls up for immediate atten-
tion the part of the city the paving
of the half mile connecting road
within the corporate limits. The
highway commission calls upon the
community to care for the highway
within the city limits, and here we
have also the question of conflicting
routes. The following letter has
been received by the county and city
officials from the highway commis-
sion bearing upon the point:

"We are advertising, as you are
doubtless aware, the pavement from
Grants Pass north to Sexton Moun-
tain, expecting that that part be-
tween Grants Pass and Louse Creek

will be completed this year and the
balance next year.

"What we desire now definitely to
know is what are the wishes of your
county and city as to the entrance
of the highway into the town from
the north. If the present graded
road is to be followed, what provi-
sion if any has been made for pav-
ing within the city limits from the
corporate limits to the pavement on
Sixth street? If your people—both
city and county—desire the entrance
to be made on the ridge connecting
with the present paving in the cor-
porate limits, have you made the ne-
cessary provision for rights of way
and grading?"

"We have had frequent communi-
cations from the Chamber of Com-
merce and other organizations and
individuals relative to the routing of
the highway and we have frequently
suggested that the county and city
officials should settle this matter, as
either route would probably be sat-

isfactory to the highway department
but the matter must now be made
definite that it can be properly cov-
ered by the contract."

To the Courier, Mayor Demaray
made the following comment follow-
ing receipt of the letter from Chair-
man Booth of the commission:

"The county court does not feel
that there is justification for three
parallel roads within one half mile.
From present indications the Pa-
cific highway will come into the city
straight from the north over the new
graded road. How the city will con-
nect up the half mile stretch to the
present pavement I do not know. All
road improvements under our pre-
sent charter fall upon the abutting
property. In the present instance
they do not seem interested. The only
legal way the city can grade and
pave it at the city's expense would
be by a special election authorizing
a tax levy for that purpose."
