RESTOCKING OUR STREAMS

There was a time when the streams of Southern Oregon were noted for the abundance of trout that they yielded to the angler. Nowhere in the country was there any place with inducements greater than the Rogue and its tributaries to bring in the sportsman. But of recent years the fishing has been poor. It has taken but a short time to deplete the river of the fish that at one time would rise to any kind of lure. It would mean much if we could hold out to sportsmen of the west a chance to fill their creels once more.

Trout fry to the number of about 12,000,000 are to be planted in the rivers and streams of the state. Josephine county should get her share of these and then see that they are protected from the "fish hog," the greatest menace to the sport that lives. The "fish hog" is not contented with catching a single mess of trout. He must get enough to feed all the neighbors. These may appreciate the favor but the man who wishes to go out and catch enough to have a little sport is bound to feel resentment against the other who takes them all.

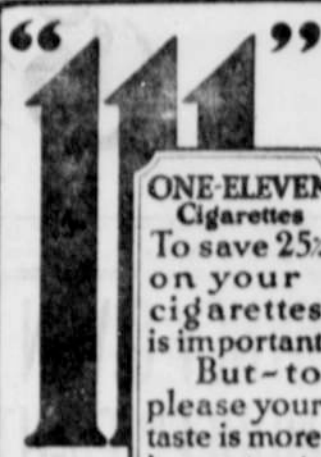
