ITALIAN POLITICS ARE LIVELY

Chamber of Deputies Faces Division Unless Differences Are Dispelled

Milan, Oct. 7.—(A. P.)—The Italian socialist party which will meet here October 10 to debate a change of tactics is represented in the Italian Chamber of Deputies by 122 members, the strongest party numerically but it is composed of dissenting groups.

Lining up for the convention are the pro-soviets, anti-government groups, anti-Russia faction, pro-unity, anti-international and centrist tendencies. They are meeting mainly to decide whether the socialist deputies shall participate in the government or line up against the government on every proposal that it makes.

The John Burroughs Memorial association has started its campaign to raise funds to purchase and maintain the various properties of the late naturalist. It is estimated it will take about \$36,000 to purchase them, and an additional \$4,000 to maintain them the first year.

The association intends to maintain the Burroughs properties as the naturalist himself maintained them. His working library, some of his original manuscripts, rifles, shotguns and fishing tackle will be exhibited. It is the opinion of the association that shrines to great men, especially shrines to literary men, are too few, and that the many friends and admirers of John Burroughs will be interested in keeping up the places in which he lived, studied and labored in the 84 years of his life.
