CAMPAIGN FOR FUNDS STARTS NEXT MONDAY

On Monday morning, April 23, the citizens of Josephine County will again have an opportunity to show their appreciation of the efforts of the Salvation Army Lasses who have had charge of the work here for the past 10 months, for on that date will open the annual home service campaign by which means it is hoped to raise the sum of \$3,000 to continue the work for the coming year.

The majority of people will remember that a campaign was put on early last July, but the amount raised was hardly sufficient to enable the officers to carry out their program. So, rather than curtail the work, it was deemed advisable to come before the people of the county with a report of what has been accomplished during the past year and again ask their support.

The budget has been submitted to the directorate of the Josephine Chamber of Commerce and approved by them and the dates have been set for April 23 to 30.

The Grants Pass Chamber of Commerce, through its president, O. S. Blanchard has endorsed the work of the Salvation Army. A statement issued to the people of Grants Pass and Josephine county by President Blanchard follows:

"Before the war we had a centralized agency for the purpose of handling charitable and other relief matters. During the war this work was carried on largely by the Red Cross. Last year neither the Red Cross nor the prewar organization desired to function in that capacity. The Salvation Army volunteered to take over that work. A meeting of representatives of religious organizations, County Court, and Red Cross was called, and the plan approved. During the past year the Salvation Army has functioned in that capacity, taking care of charitable work, outside of permanent cases. The work has been satisfactory, and, at a meeting held a few days ago, the plan for raising money for the ensuing year, was approved.

"The work by the Salvation Army, carried on in the manner followed during the past year, is satisfactory and prevents duplication; and the plan has the approval of the Chamber of Commerce and of myself, personally."
