CLEAN CAMP SITES

The campaign to interest motor vacationists in the movement instituted by the Motorists League for Countryside Preservation to keep camp sites and highways free from papers or other litter, is meeting with enthusiastic cooperation, it was announced at the League's headquarters today.

Hundreds of letters and pledge cards, containing promises to "clean up" after stops along the roadsides, are being received daily. The response is not confined to men in public life but covers also the so-called private citizen who "tunes up" his flivver for week-end outings during the hot summer months.

William G. Shepherd made a pertinent query when he mailed in his pledge recently, "Where will I throw it?" Mr. Shepherd wants to know.

At the suggestion of officials of the League, the editors of MoTor, the national magazine of Motoring, have undertaken to solve this problem in the current issues of the magazine. Of course, many municipally operated camp sites are equipped with receptacles for the garbage and litter of campers, but many tourists prefer to make their stops at spots removed from such sites. MoTor suggests, in this connection, that garages be equipped with barrels and that motorists convey their after-the-picnic litter to garages, invariably, cars

Officers and "gobs" aboard the ship got out their fishing tackle, and it was only after scores of these huge monsters of the sea had been taken from the water and killed that there seemed to be any let up at all. Later the big ulua and other food fish came around and in less than an hour members of the crew had taken aboard a catch of almost 1,000 lbs.

At Ocean Island seals were found in abundance, basking on the sand. Birds, too, were plentiful here, for there were no rabbits, and the vegetation was still quite dense.

One of the results of the trip is that the Tanager now has as its mascot "Kicky", a wild burro captured on Eastern Island, a little atoll near Midway. "Kicky" and more than a score of his immediate relatives, who were found on Eastern Island, are the descendants of a pair of burros taken out to the cable station at Midway years ago.

After the arrival of the original pair at Midway it was discovered that they were multiplying so fast that the island would not have room enough to hold them, and all were deported to Eastern Island. Wholly untamed, the herd is now roaming over this little atoll in the middle of the Pacific, and it was only after considerable difficulty that "Kicky" was captured and brought aboard the Tanager by the "gobs". Several more cruises are planned for the Summer.

The first cruise of the Tanager extended all the way to Midway Island, the farthest west of the Hawaiian group, and included Bird Island, French Frigate Shoals, Gardner's Island and many of the coral reefs en route.

At Laysan, the party reported, there was evidence of a bitter war which had been waging between the rabbits and the plant life of the island. Pictures taken a few years ago show an island well covered with vegetation of considerable variety, though none higher than bushes. Now the island is nearly bare and covered with sand. Rabbits were everywhere. Although the land birds had suffered with the plants the albatrosses, with their downy, recently hatched young drawn closely about them, were there in thousands, nestling on the bare sand so close together that members of the party in places had to pick a path between them.

No sooner had the Tanager anchored off Yaysan than the sharks began to come alongside.

Honolulu, June 13.—(I. N.
