KANSAS CITY ALREADY MAKING BIG PLANS FOR ENTERTAINMENT OF SHRINERS IN 1924

Kansas City, Mo., June 21.—(I. N. S.)—Taking time by the forelock, Kansas City already is turning toward consideration of plans for entertaining the national convention of the Ancient Arabic Order of Nobles of the Mystic Shrine here June 2-4, inclusive, 1924.

The meeting is expected to overshadow in size and significance any similar event held in Kansas City, if not in the country. Fully 50,000 Shriners are expected to attend, and it is believed that 100,000 visitors will come to this city, this estimate being based on Kansas City's central location and the possibility that this will be the last national conclave of the Shrine.

It is estimated \$300,000 will be required to finance the affair, \$100,000 of which already has been underwritten by the Chamber of Commerce. The Shrine must raise \$50,000 from the outside.

Russel F. Griener, president of the

Rotary Club, declared every organization in the city must get behind the campaign. Last year's conclave in San Francisco cost upward of \$300,000, he said, part of which was subscribed by the Knights of Columbus.

Before trying to land the convention a resolutions committee ascertained local facilities. According to Alonzo B. Clark, head of the Hotel Men's Association, it was found that more than 7,000 rooms will be available.

Added to this, the convention bureau has been promised parking space for about 500 Pullman cars by W. M. Corbett, president of the Terminal Railroad. Delegates desiring to remain in these quarters may do so, all comforts and conveniences to be furnished.

The 600 imperial council delegates will be cared for in the Hotels Baltimore and Muehlbach; the others will be handled by reservations

with a housing committee. Every effort, Clark says, will be made to keep hotel rates down. "We promised the resolutions committee that there would positively be no hike in rates. We have all facilities necessary, and everyone will be taken care of. I fully expect 50,000 Shriners."

J. Frank Smith, manager of the Greater Kansas City Good Roads Association, said the organization would cooperate with Shrine motor car caravans, which are expected to journey here.

Kansas City is ninth in Shrine membership among 155 temples in North America. The local Ararat Temple has approximately 9,000 members, 5,200 of whom reside here. Kansas City entertained the national convention in 1901, when there were only 1200 members.

Convention Hall will be obtained for the big event next June. The new baseball park will likely be used for some of the outdoor ceremonies.
