property. The sale was for cash, the money already being in the hands of the receiver for the property, E. H. Ester. Possession was taken as soon as the money had been paid as no time will be lost in getting the property under way in producing the mineral. As the abstract was passed upon by lawyers for the mining interests, it is felt that no further trouble will be experienced.

The Oriole has been one of the most consistent gold producers in Josephine county. Development work had progressed rapidly until the mine was thrown in litigation and work was suspended. There are four tunnels which have been run into the mountain, making about a mile of underground development. In Tunnel three, which is about 600 feet in length, \$50,000 in gold is known to have been taken out. The other tunnels also produced their share of ore which runs in places from \$250 to \$500 to the ton. The edge was tapped 500 feet under the surface of the earth, this ledge being 200 feet in width.

### AMERICAN WOMEN HAVE SPLENDID CLUB HOUSE

London, July 21.—(I. N. S.)—

American women domiciled in London, and those visiting London for any period, now have an up-to-date and palatial club for themselves.

The club, which is in the fashionable Grosvenor Square quarter, was formerly the residence of Sir Edgar Speyer, and was purchased from him for \$100,000. It was officially opened by Mrs. Post Wheeler.

Mrs. Curtis Brown was elected president at the club's first meeting. It was revealed that the membership, which is restricted to American women, is already between five and six thousand, while the associate membership, which admits English wives of American citizens, is also very large.

Lady Astor, who spoke at the meeting, ventured to express the hope that the club would become a "center of political agitation," where every American woman could go and say what she thought of England. The chief object of their gatherings, however, she hazarded, would be to provide a social center in London for American women and to keep them in touch with the homeland.

Thousands of dollars have been spent on making the premises probably the most luxurious and decorative women's club in the world. Rooms which include a bathroom tiled in blue marble, in which is sunk a deep silver oval bath, and huge bedrooms which look as if they had been transplanted from Venice, are among the wonders of this upper-club. Every bedroom contains valuable old furniture in keeping with the "period" decorations, while the oak-paneled lounge hall contains some of the most wonderful carvings in London. A Regent period ballroom, complete with minstrel's gallery; a chestnut paneled dining room, Gothic staircase and charming Old World Italian flower garden are among other features.

All the standard American delicacies, even down to clam chowder, are obtainable in the dining room.

#### British Parliament Houses.

The houses of parliament cover an area of eight acres, and have a river frontage of 340 feet. They contain more than 300 rooms, and about 18 residences, the resident population being about 200.

## DAIRY FACTS

### WAGE WAR ON TUBERCULOSIS

Besides Organized Forces There Are Thousands of Accredited Veterinarians Helping.

Tuberculosis of live stock is being attacked on all sides. In addition to the large force of federal, state and county veterinarians engaged in the nationwide campaign for eradicating this disease, there are thousands of accredited veterinarians assisting with the work. Records of the bureau of animal industry, United States Department of Agriculture, show that on March 1, 1923, there were 5,120 accredited veterinarians in the United States. As accredited herds are established the various states turn them over to accredited veterinarians, who test them annually at the expense of the owner. This permits county, state and federal veterinarians to devote all their time to herds that have not been accredited.

The federal government keeps in close touch with the accredited veterinarians and furnishes them every few months with information regarding the disease and any unusual conditions that may be encountered in the herds under supervision.

The tuberculosis-free accredited herd list is increasing very rapidly. The report of the bureau of animal industry just published shows that on March 1, 1923, there were 24,132 fully accredited herds, 290,034 once-tested free herds, and 332,887 herds under supervision.

### MUDDY BARN LOT IS COSTLY

Additional Work Heaped on Dairyman Every Way He Turns—Clean Stable Pays Best.

A poorly drained barnyard costs the dairyman more money than he imagines. In some cases, no doubt, it costs him more than the laying of the necessary tile through which to keep it dry. It means additional work for him pretty nearly every way he turns—dirty cows, dirty stables and an extra physical effort on his own part in the matter of going about his chores with mud-caked boots. If he sells his milk locally from house to house, he probably loses many a customer who associates thoughts of the general appearance of the barn and its surroundings with the milk which is being delivered to his home. Clean environment in the case of a dairy barn offers a telling argument, in an advertising way, for the milk produced amid these surroundings.

### COW TESTING IS IMPORTANT

Record Showing High Production of Animal Greatly Increases Price of Bull Calf.

A farmer sold a male calf for \$35. Later its dam was tested for advanced registry. When the yearly record was completed it was found that the cow produced over 22,000 pounds of milk and 681 pounds of butter. Her next bull calf was sold for \$300. This indicates in a concrete way something of the value of testing dairy cows.

#### Production of Cows.

Average production of dairy cows in the United States is 3,412 pounds of milk per cow per year. In Holland it is 7,585 pounds; Switzerland, 6,950 pounds, and Denmark, 5,000 pounds.
