the fiscal system of the country without taking a general verdict. Bonar Law is dead. His successors want to make the change, and they are asking Britain for its verdict.

It will be a terrific fight. It will split all British parties from one end to the other. Every party—Conservative, National Liberal, Independent Liberal, Labor—has the idea of the contest. No section definitely knows where it will stand three months hence. The political future of Britain is being cast into a melting pot.

Half the Conservative Party are Free Traders. Lord Salisbury, his brother Lord Robert Cecil; Lord Curzon, a number of minor members of the Administration—all are pledged to Free Trade. Liberals and Laborites are also, nominally, Free Traders. But there is every sign of a definite cleavage cutting across their ranks on this question. Old time Liberals are saying that the war has entirely changed all economic conditions, and all previous theories must be revised. Several of the most prominent Labor Leaders are inquiring whether a tariff would not be good for the British home market. The election will mean new and

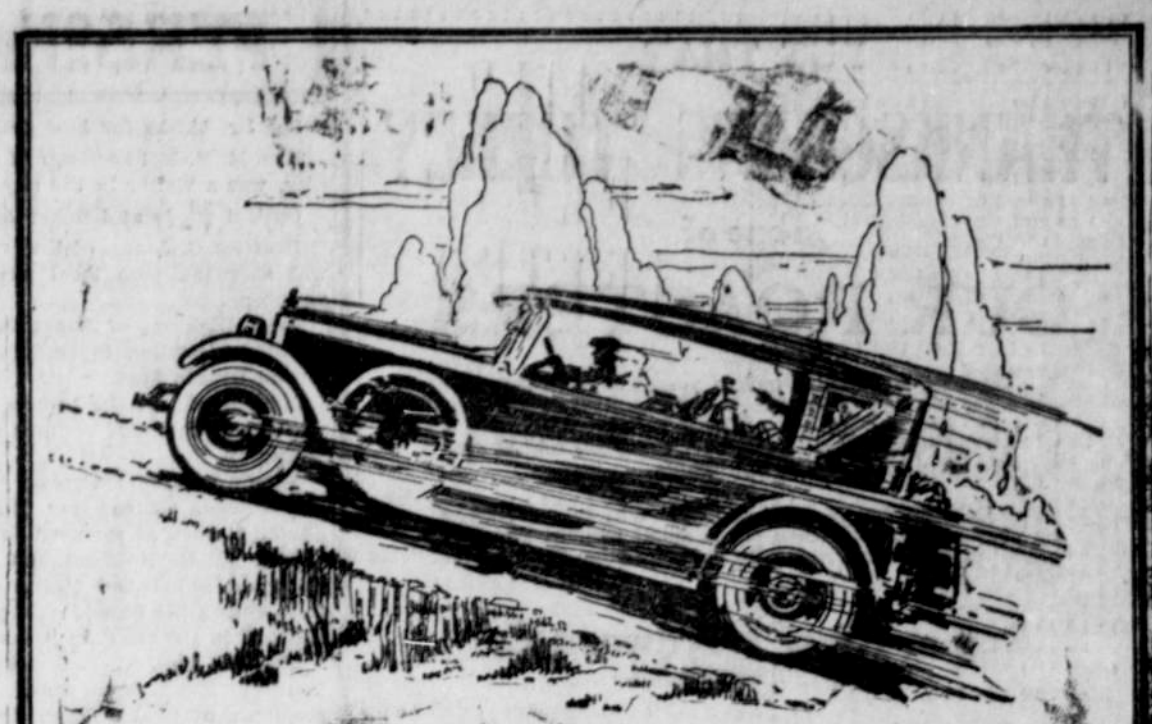
