Paris, Dec. 13.—(I. N. S.)—To breakfast or not to breakfast—that was the question laid before the French Academy of Medicine. After having accepted the English weekend, which means a half-holiday on Saturday, the French are looking in to the merits of a breakfast of bacon and eggs. In Paris to breakfast means to drink. A cup of cafe au lait or chocolate (rarely tea), with a "croissant," or warm roll, spells breakfast to the average French family.

Women can be judges is Czechoslovakia. A conference of the chief judges of Czechoslovakian courts has just decided to allow women to exercise the function of judges. One has already been appointed a deputy judge.

It pays to be a manicurist in Paris. Since the war men, as well as women have become very careful of their hands and nails. A few years ago it was scarcely necessary to have a manicurist in a barber shop. Now one finds four or five, each one averaging ten pairs of hands a day and on Saturday, "the big night," at least twenty-five. With the tips, each one earns about 25 or 30 francs a day.

The remains of a prehistoric bison have been found in the course of dredging operations in the River Saone, near Chalon-sur-Saone. The head is of enormous size and still contains ten teeth in very good condition.

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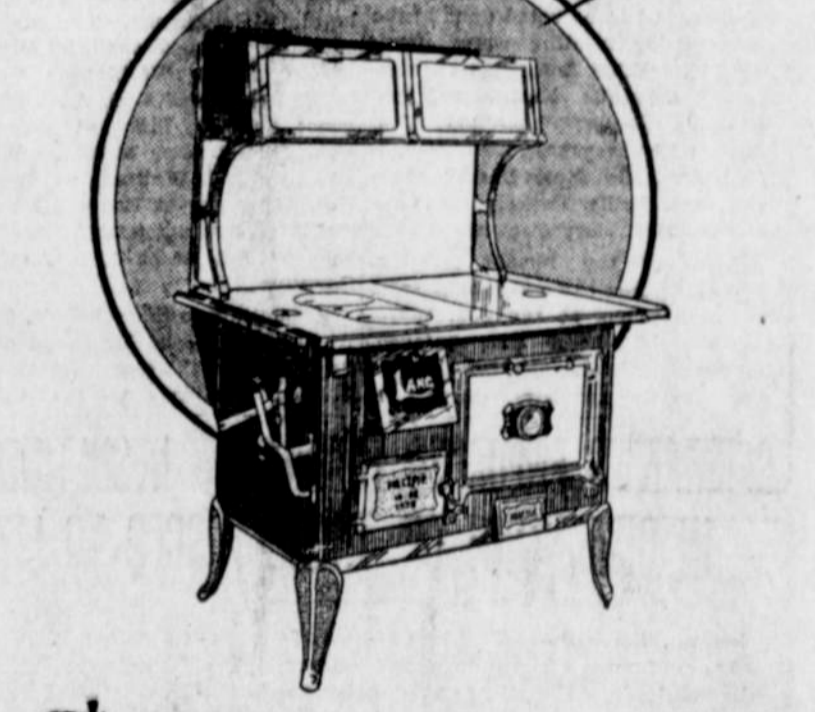
