range to its receiving ability.

The induction coil has four windings, two of which are compensated. When installed they are adjusted by Mr. Offins so that the correct wave length will be registered. With this tuner, Mr. Offins picked up Schenectady, New York, Pittsburgh, Cleveland, Mexico City and numerous other distant stations. This reception was with an inside aerial and a single tube. Five different aerials were used in perfecting the tuner.

Mr. Offins is not out soliciting orders but has already promised to put out 35 sets. The most of these are to be done before Christmas. Two of the sets will be installed at Anderson, Calif., two at Klamath Falls, two at Roseburg and others in many other cities of southern Oregon and northern California. Twenty-five of these are now on the road to completion. More orders are being received and the manufacture of radio sets seems to be a coming industry of this city. One of these days Mr. Offins will probably branch out from his tiny shop and take up more pretentious quarters.
