CLUB PLANTS WILD RICE

Montana Gun Organization Acts to Attract Ducks.

Some 1,300 pounds of wild rice is to be planted in reservoirs and lakes in the vicinity of Polson, Mont., for the feeding and attraction of ducks. The Polson Rod and Gun club, with the assistance of the state fish and game commission, is back of the move. Some wild rice was planted in several places in the vicinity last year as an experiment. It grew well where the seed was not washed out by unusually high water. The first shipment of 850 pounds, costing the club \$300, is being soaked preparatory to planting, under the direction of F. L. Vance of Deer Lake, Minn., who has had many years' experience in rice cultivation.
