poultry unit with an outlay of approximately \$1200 and with a flock of 400 hens, get a net return of \$700 to \$1200 yearly. The banks of the state have started loaning money on dairy cattle and are also beginning to loan on chicken ventures. A federal loan bank is also to loan on dairy herds for the building up of that industry.

Cooperation by sawmill men of the county with the land settlement question is sought by the state officers. They are asked to give employment to actual settlers wherever possible to aid the settler in getting through the low production period, which is the critical point.

That section west of the Cascades in Oregon has no equal on the coast, said Mr. Boise. It also constitutes the last great undeveloped region in the world. The Rogue river valley came in for a large amount of praise and was declared to be "matchless."

Mr. Faville stated that Grants Pass is the best organized community in the state for getting results. The community spirit here was praised and the community came in for a large amount of praise. GASOLINE TO BE PREFERRED

Better Than Kerosene for Washing Bearings, Cleaning Brakes and Running Board.

For all cleaning purposes, including washing of bearings, cleaning brakes and running boards, gasoline is always to be preferred to kerosene for the reason that it evaporates directly after completing the job. Gasoline, however, should not be used for external cleaning of the engine; and kerosene that is used for this purpose should only be applied when the power plant is cold.

Any opening in the valve tappet compartment when warm air can blow in is likely to result in drying the valve stems and making them stick. Such an opening, when found, can be plugged with felt.

A little scheme that makes it easier to back out of a driveway is to make a little notch in the under side of the steering wheel nearest the driver when the front wheels are in a straight-ahead position. If the driver starts backing straight and keeps the notch in the original position the car ought not to run off its course.

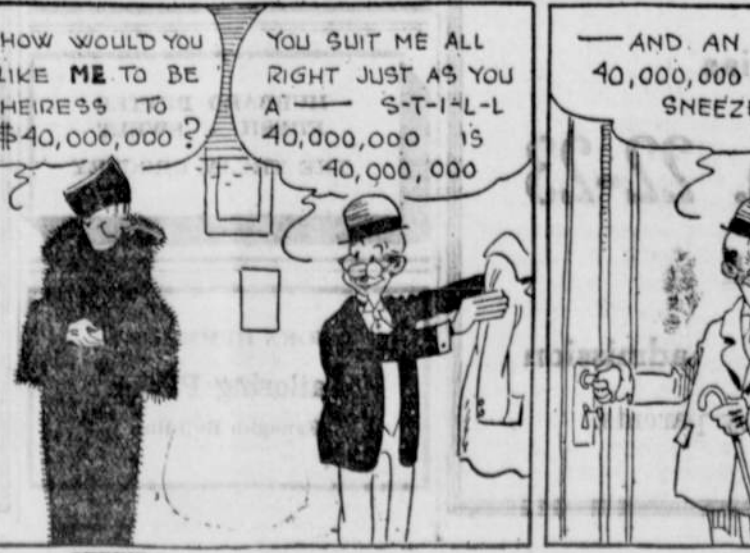
