Natural Levees. A levee is an embankment which keeps a river in its channel. A river like the Mississippi carries a great amount of sediment from its swift headstreams to the lower ground. When its velocity is checked, it drops a portion of this sediment, gradually raising the bed of the stream above the surrounding country. In flood II time, the river overflows its banks, depositing sediment along the land side of the banks. This creates a long alluvial ridge, which is called a natural
