Coast Road to Be Improved—

The work on the Redwood highway over Oregon mountain to the Oregon line will receive the attention of the county court. The county will expend \$1000 on this road and the federal government, through the forest service, will add \$500. The stage company has decided not to assist in the work this season. Due to the fact that a heavy traffic is expected over the highway the court wants to get the road in as good condition as possible.

Lucile Saunders Coming—

Lucile Saunders, special writer for the Portland Oregonian, will make a trip through the national forests of Oregon, according to word received at the office of the local forest service. Miss Saunders, who has made a trip through South America for the same paper, expects to travel down the coast, across the southern part of the state and into southeastern Oregon. She is looking for stories of unusual interest. Miss Saunders wrote a number of articles on Southern Oregon last fall.

Will Give Lecture—

An illustrated lecture on forest protection will be given next Tuesday evening at the high school by Albert Weisendanger, of the forest service at Portland. Mr. Weisendanger spoke in Grants Pass about a year ago and will be remembered as an extremely interesting speaker. His talk will start at 8 o'clock and, while it will be of especial interest to school children, will also have a message for the older people. Radio fans will remember Mr. Weisendanger because of the harmonica contests conducted by the Morning Oregonian in their radio station last summer. Mr. Weisendanger was the winner of the contest. He has charge of the Eagle Creek camp ground.

Roth Buys Water Plant—

The Rogue River Water Company was sold to J. A. Roth, representing Los Angeles and eastern capital. It is announced that there will be no change in the personnel, policy or rates at this time. R. W. Clarke will continue as local manager. Mr. Roth expects to stop here in a few days while en route to Portland.

Fear Dry River—

Many Inquiries Made—

Inquiries numbering 429 were received Thursday by the Chamber of Commerce as a result of the advertising campaign to attract tourists, settlers and investors to Oregon. This is the largest number received in one day since the campaign started. Three hundred of the inquiries are in reply to the full page advertisement which appeared in last Sunday's issue of the Los Angeles Times in connection with a full page layout of Oregon scenes in the rotogravure section. More than 99 per cent of the inquirers said they are coming to Oregon during the coming summer, many of them to spend several weeks and they desire road maps and pamphlets descriptive of the country. A large number will spend considerable time in Central and Eastern Oregon.—Portland Telegram.

Natural Levees.

A levee is an embankment which keeps a river in its channel. A river like the Mississippi carries a great amount of sediment from its swift headwaters to the lower ground. When its velocity is checked, it drops a portion of this sediment, gradually raising the bed of the stream above the surrounding country. In flood time, the river overflows its banks, depositing sediment along the land side of the banks. This creates a long alluvial ridge, which is called a natural levee.

Basis of Time Reckoning.

The basis of reckoning standard time at the United States Naval Observatory is transit observation of the stars. The observatory has three standard clocks running in a constant temperature vault, electrically wound and sealed to keep the air pressure constant. Meridian circle observations of selected stars are taken regularly on clear nights, and from these observations the errors of the standard clocks are determined and corrected.

Many Crops of Leaves.

Evergreen trees differ from deciduous trees, which shed all their leaves annually, in that the leaves of evergreen trees last for a full year or more. This means, says Nature Magazine of Washington, that one crop of leaves can always be found on an evergreen tree and sometimes as many as five or even ten annual leaf crops at one time.

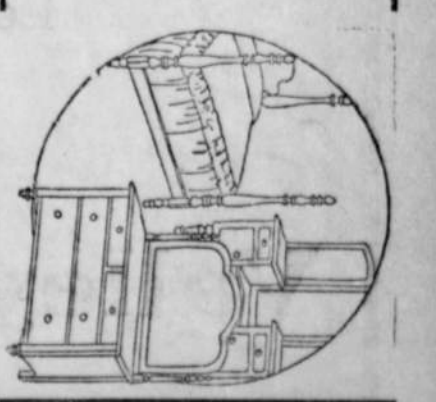
