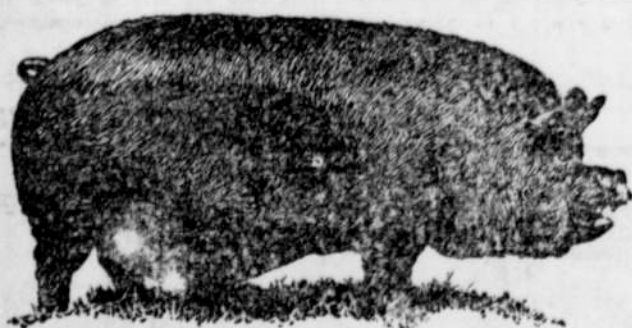

Will Survey Highway—

It is proposed to solicit contributions from the various friends of the enterprise, for the purpose of defraying the cost of making the survey this summer. It is understood that such a survey shall be made under the direction of the State Highway Commission, which will insure its value as a step toward final achievement. NATURAL GAS FOUND
IN KLAMATH COUNTY

Klamath Falls, Ore., June 13.—(A. P.)—Natural gas, said to be of petroleum type and reported in quantities sufficient to light a large city, was discovered today issuing from eight fissures in the dry bed of Tule lake, seven miles south east of Merrill, Ore.

J. D. Howard, Klamath county geologist, who made the discovery, has applied tests to prove the gas is not carbonic acid or hydrogen sulphide. From a tube attached to one of the vents the gas was ignited and burned with intense heat, throwing a flame more than a foot in length.

MEPHISTO IN FRENCH OFFENDS
GERMAN NATIONALIST CRITICS

Berlin, June 13.—(A.
