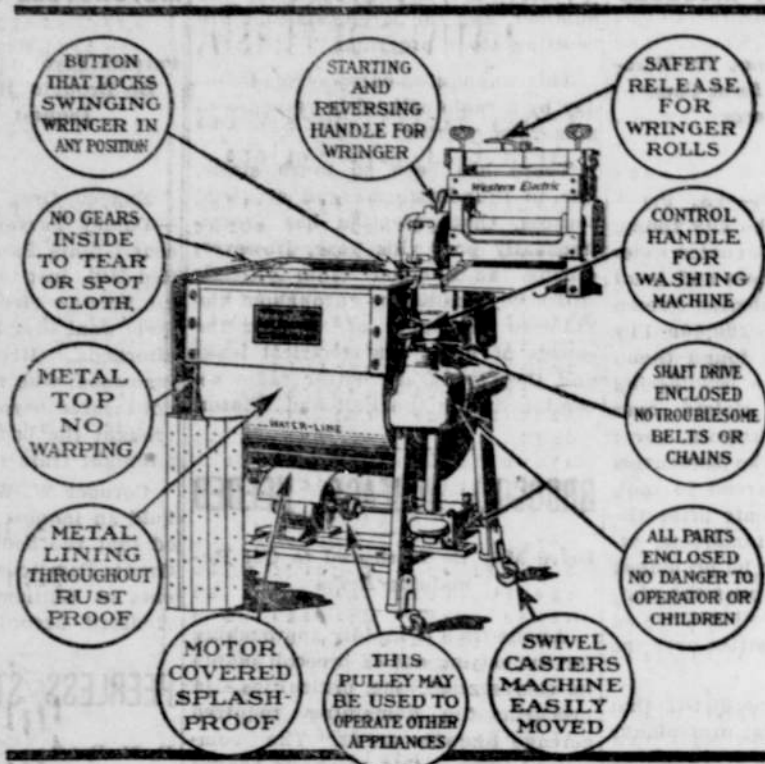

The awards are on display in the window of Holman's furniture store.

CONTEST RULES

Rules governing the baking contest:—The rules are few and simple—here they are:

1. Articles entered in the baking contest are to be baked at home in any kind of stove or range.
2. Any woman or girl in Josephine county is entitled to enter the contest except of course professional cooks, and employees of the Courier and their families.
3. Insofar as possible the food-stuffs used in the cooking contest are to be the same as used in the cooking classes.
4. The contest is to be divided into three classes: Bread, Pie and Cake.
5. Any kind of bread, pie and cake may be entered.

6. Any one person is entitled to enter one article in each one of the three divisions if they so desire.

7. All food entered is to be the property of the Courier.

8. Please do NOT bring your entries on plates you desire to keep. No plates will be returned.

9. The judging of the bread, pies and cakes will be handled by three local judges selected by the Courier. In all cases their decision will be final.

10. Prizes will be awarded by the judges on Friday afternoon, June 27th, at the close of the afternoon session.

11. All entries must be delivered at the Woodman Hall between 10 and noon on Friday, June 27th.

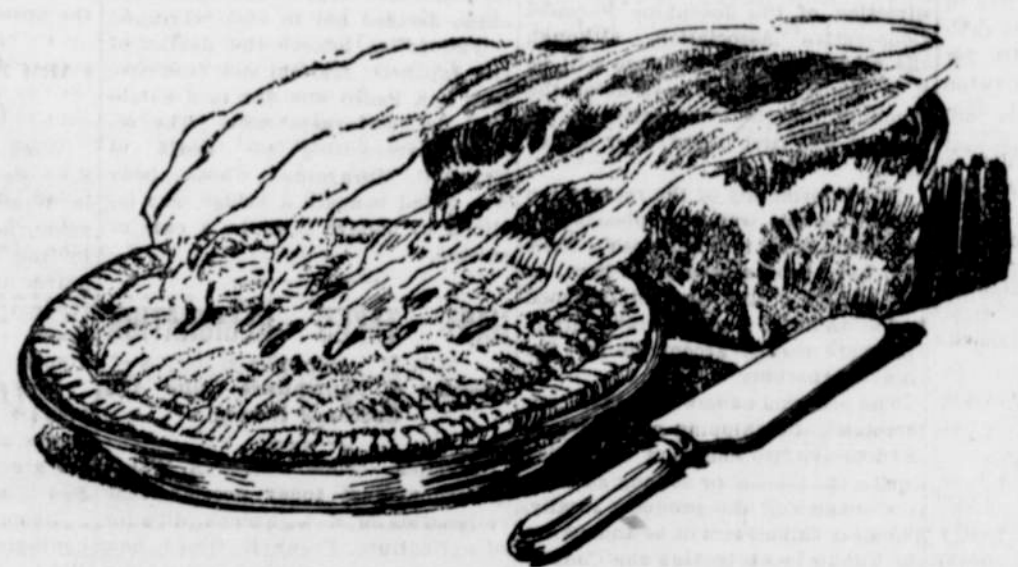
