in the world, called "the Devil's Bible," and also the "giant of books," has been brought out of its hiding place in the royal library of Stockholm, following a request for a photostat copy from the city of Prague, where it was captured at the Swedish conquest in 1648. It was written 800 years ago, and legend says that it ins completed during a single night by a monk who was doomed to die. He had to have assistance from the devil, however, and in gratitude made a fullpage portrait of him, horns, cloven hoof and all, which has ever since remained in the Bible, according to the Detroit News.

The book is probably the largest Bible in the world, the pages being a yard high by a foot and a half wide, It is written on 300 parchment sheets, for which, according to tradition, 100 donkey hides were required. The lettering is beautifully illuminated in gold and bright colors.
