In addition to the quilts, the show also will include door prizes offered throughout both days. Vendors will be on hand selling their products and there will be a Country Store where quilting-related items will be sold for reduced prices. Prizes will be awarded to the winners of a game of "Find the Quilt Block" during the event.

The quilt show is not judged, but a People's Choice award of a special gift basket will be presented to the maker of the crowd's favorite quilt during both days.

Morris, who has her own quilt pattern business, travels to quilt shows around the region and has picked up new techniques and gadgets to share with her fellow club members and has brought back new ideas for upgrading the Baker City show.

Lowry, 74, is the group's leader and serves as the club's secretary/treasurer. "She keeps everybody lined out," said Morris, 67.

Both women come from a long line of quilters.

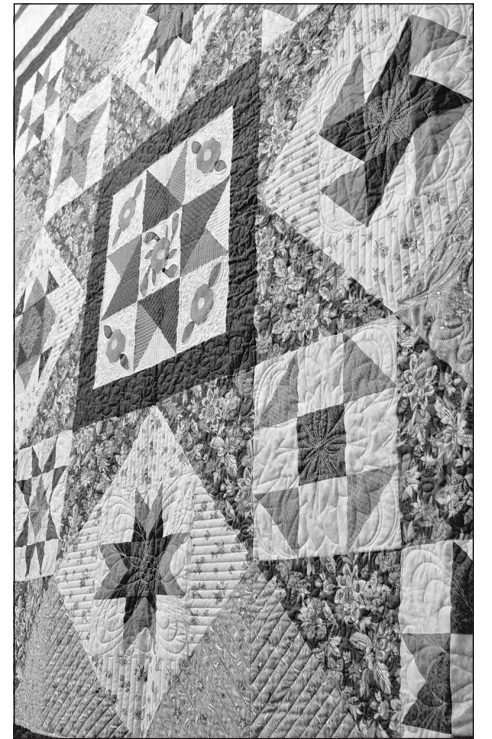
Morris' mother, Betty Green, and her grandmother, Erma Emmons, both were longtime quilters.

Emmons continued quilting even after losing her eyesight.

"My grandfather (Charlie Emmons), every morning would get up and thread 30 needles for her. She sewed 30 needles a day," Morris said. "She quilted by hand and she pieced by hand."

Lowry's mother-in-law, Sallie Lowry, who lived to the age of 96, made quilts for more than 100 grandkids, Virginia said.

"It was well over 105 because my son was Number 105 and there were several after him," she said. "Then there were great-grandchildren and great-great-grandchildren and I have lost track of how many there are."
