Continued from Page 1A Organizers said they're expecting 40 bull riders Saturday and 35 bronc riders Friday for two of the signature events during the Miners Jubilee weekend.

Organizer Ken McPheron said the Baker City events are competing with other rodeos this weekend, so registration is open until the last minute. He expects to "get some exceptional cowboys here."

McPheron said one of the highlights is the crowd the event draws every year.

"We have some pretty loyal fans," he said. "We have a full house every year."

He said the \$25,000 prize draws some big names to Baker including the Wright brothers of Utah and Ryan Mackenzie of Jordan Valley who will all return this year to vie for another title.

"It's some of the best bronc riding in the U.S.," said McPheron.

For Owens it's fun to compete in Baker, despite the added pressure of trying to hang on for eight seconds with his family and friends looking on.

"It's Baker. You can't walk down the street without seeing someone you know," he said.


While this rodeo is an important test for him, Owens said it's also a big deal for family members who have urged the rider to hang up his competition gear.

"I think my family's showing up because they're worried," he said.

He's not ready to listen to their advice yet, though.

'I'm not ready to quit riding bulls," said Owens. "I don't think I'll ever be ready to hang it up. Wanting to get on never leaves."

Owens said he's not as worried about getting hurt riding bulls as he is about the

implications on his ranching career outside of the rodeo.

"If I won the lotto, I'd ride bulls till the day I die," he said, because he wouldn't have to worry about maintaining his business when he's not in the arena.

He grew up on his family's commercial ranch and continued that lifestyle.

The leg fracture he

suffered last August was his worst as a rider, And although Owens said the bone is "as healed as it's going to get," he has arthritis in his knee that makes it painful for him to ride a horse for too

long. Owens began his rodeo career nine years ago during his sophomore year of high

injuries since then, including beating up his collar bone, ribs, shoulder and leg.

"There are things that are out of my control. All I can do is my best," he said, citing the unpredictability of the draw for bulls in addition to his health, "You want to ride your bulls. Before you can think about winning, you have to ride your bulls."




