Chip-sealing project scheduled to start Aug. 13

Starting Monday, Aug. 13, the Baker City Public Works Department will be chip-sealing sections of more than a dozen streets, totaling almost four miles.

The work is scheduled to take four days (see map at

Chip-sealing is intended to extend the life of streets by sealing the pavement and preventing water from penetrating.

A minimum 48 hours notice will be provided to residents along affected streets. Drivers should expect delays and possible detours. If work is delayed by weather it would be rescheduled for the next available day.



The county has also set up power generator systems in case of electricity outages during fires. A generator has been installed in Bowen Valley just south of Baker City, and county officials are working on setting up systems in Baker City and at the Lions Club in Halfway.

Harvey said that the county plans to partner with WorkSource Oregon to teach, train and employ high school students and young adults to work on the fuel reduction project.

The partnership would let the students work during the summer and then take a forestry class with WorkSource during the

"We want to introduce them to this because we hope that out of that we will get people who go on in a career of it," Harvey

The U.S. Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management and Oregon Department of Forestry estimate that they would be able to hire 20 to 25 employees a year with training similar to what the project would provide, Harvey said.



He hopes the fuel reduction program will be approved by this winter so work can start in the spring of 2019.

"This is ridiculous how long it takes to do something that is so badly needed. I mean if you remove the fuel from the forest the threat is gone," he said.

The county has received far more inquiries about participating in the program than the county has funding for.

"What we will attempt to do is, do this project, show the federal government we have a good track record and then maybe go with a different agency to gain funding and do it again," Harvey said.


