Then, with Baker leading 23-11 Abby Baker served the final two points.


Serving continued to be Baker's strength in the third

## **Mariners top A's,** clinch AL West title for Astros

SEATTLE — The Oakland Athletics knew they'd been fortunate to get this deep in the season without seeing their bullpen blow a late lead.

It finally happened on Tuesday night, and in the process wrapped up the AL West title for the Houston Astros and sent the A's into a wild-card matchup with the New York Yankees.

Pinch-hitter Chris Herrmann's two-run homer in the 11th inning capped Seattle's late rally and gave the Mariners a 10-8 win over Oakland. Seattle overcame an 8-5 eighth-inning deficit and dropped the A's 21/2 games behind the Yankees for home-field advantage in the Oct. 3 winner-take-all matchup.

Oakland had been 68-0 when leading after seven

"We have a lot of confidence we're going to finish games, our bullpen is such a strength for us," Oakland manager Bob Melvin said. "To go perfect through the course of a season is probably tough to do."

Seattle's rally started with Denard Span's two-run double off Fernando Rodney in the eighth. Blake Treinen was one strike from closing out his 38th save in the ninth, but Nelson Cruz punched a two-out single, Ryon Healy reached when third baseman Matt Chapman bobbled his grounder for an error and Kyle Seager hit an RBI single. Treinen had allowed just one hit in his previous 13 appearances.

### **Reed relishes role in Ryder Cup**

SAINT-QUENTIN-EN-YVELINES, France Patrick Reed relishes the role of Captain America.

He's just as comfortable being Public Enemy No. 1 at the Ryder Cup.

"I'm supposed to be the villain, just like when Ian Poulter comes to the States, he's the villain." Reed smirked.

Reed was a convenient target of the European faithful at Gleneagles back in 2014, telling them to hush after he made a big putt.

Nothing figures to change when the U.S. tries to retain the cup at Le Golf National just outside of Paris this weekend.

As far as Reed is concerned, bring it on.

"There's really nothing to get underneath my skin, that's for sure." Reed said.

He clearly relishes the charged atmosphere of a Ryder Cup, having lost only one of nine matches over his first two appearances. At Hazeltine two vears ago, he teamed with Jordan Spieth to go 3-0-1 in foursomes and four-balls before beating Rory McIlroy in singles on the final day, leading the Americans to their first victory since 2008.

Now, the 28-year-old Reed is eager to end another drought.

The U.S. team has gone a quarter-century since its last victory in Europe.

Hide barrels are located throughout Baker County at the following locations: the alley behind the Elks Lodge, Halfway, Richland, North Powder, Salisbury Junction, both sides of Sumpter Junction, Whitney, Unity, Austin Junction, Burnt River Junction on the south side of Dooley Mountain and now located at Little Suzie's

and Baker County Custom Meats.

Hides should be free of legs and head. Hunters can help ensure the best price by taking the following precautions: Care by not dragging the animal for great distances. Avoid cutting holes in the hide. Get the hide to a barrel while it is still fresh and put a couple of pounds of table salt on the hide if possible and roll it before dropping it in the barrel and do not put the

hide in a plastic bags.
