US FOREST SERVICE PUBLIC NOTICE

On Friday, October 26, 2018, the Forest Service published a legal notice ("Legal Notice of Additional Opportunity to Submit a Request for Interested Person Status") in The Oregonian regarding the Revised Land Management Plans (Forest Plans) for the Malheur, Umatilla, and Wallowa-Whitman National Forests (Blue Mountains). The 60-day objection-filing period ended on August 28, 2018, and the objection letters received by the Forest Service are available for public review at www.fs.usda.gov/goto/BlueMountainsPlanRevision. Due to the large volume of objections that the Forest Service had to process, as well as delays that occurred in mail services, there were objections that were not posted online for review during the initial 10-day filing period held in September. Therefore, the Forest Service has made these newly-posted objections available for re-
