Baker's boys and girls cross country teams performed very well at the Class 4A State meet Saturday at Lane Community College in Eugene. The boys finished sixth and the girls ninth.

"All seven runners for the girls team performed at or better than their personal best, despite a slow course that had soaked in the rains of the previous week," said Baker coach Suzy Cole.

"I am super proud of how the girls competed and how they worked hard all year long," Cole said. "It is amazing to think about where these girls were three years ago, and how much they have improved throughout their high school years. Our goal was to finish in the top ten, and we finished ninth."

Cole said she would not single any of the girls out, as they all ran so well as a team and each of them met their personal goals for the competition.

Kale Cassidy finished seventh overall and led the boys team to a sixth-place finish, which matched their goal for the event. He finished as the second fastest runner in all of Eastern Oregon, and there is tremendous competition on this side of the state.

"I am so proud of Kale. He was one of about a dozen runners that were in contention to be State Champion. His time was excellent today and this has qualified him for a special follow-on event known as Border Clash."

that features the top athletes from the states of Oregon and Washington and is hosted by Nike at its world headquarters in Beaverton.

Like the girls, all of the boys ran near their personal best, with some athletes having their best run of the year.

"It was great having Johnny Niehaus back and healthy. It has been quite a while since he has been able to run with the team. He had a tremendous PR today," said Cole.

Cole also spoke well of the

freshmen competitors.

"Our freshman did an amazing job and represented us very well in this high-pressure situation of a state competition."

Cole also had praise for Lucas Stearns.

"Lucas had a big race. He developed a strategy for the race and stuck with it. It is the second time this year that he broke 18 minutes for the race."

Cole also spoke of the performance of Alex Gross.

"Alex had a great race. He

is the only senior on either of our squads that made it to State. He finished the season very well and is a huge asset to the team."

Cole noted that of the 31 athletes participating on the cross country team, only two are seniors. Two others are exchange students.

"So it looks like we will have a nucleus of 27 athletes back for the 2019 season, plus all newcomers are welcome. I am so excited for our program

and for next year as well!"

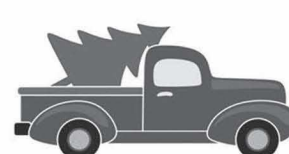
