# Harvey wins; 5J bond fails

Incumbent Bill Harvey earned another four-year term as Baker County Commission chairman, and voters by a wide margin rejected a \$48 million school construction bond for the Baker School District in Tuesday's election.

Harvey defeated challenger Bruce Nichols, who is also a commissioner, 4,142 votes (53.1 percent) to 3,626 (46.5 percent), according to unofficial results from the Baker County Clerk's office.

Harvey won by a much larger margin than in the May primary, when he received 45 percent of the votes compared with Nichols' 43 percent.

A third candidate, Mike Downing,

primary.

"I just want to thank all the citizens of Baker County that went through the process and I like the process, I appreciate it and it is the way our country is built on," Harvey said Tuesday night. "I look forward to serving for another four years."

The school district bond measure, which would have paid to build a new elementary school for grades

received 11 percent of the votes in the 1-6, remodel Baker High School to accommodate seventh- and eighthgraders, and make energy and safety improvements at other schools, failed by a more than 2-to-1 margin.

Voters rejected the measure, which would have been the first of its kind in the Baker 5J District since 1948, by a margin of 4,725 votes (68.4 percent) to 2,185 (31.6 percent).

The Blue Cousin of the Leo Adler House is now

being used as an Airbnb.

The Baer House, at 2333 Main St., and built in 1882, was purchased in August by Jody and Ranee Solmonsson. The Adler and Baer houses have one house be-

tween them. The Baer house is actually seven years older than the more well-known Adler House, which was built in 1889 and is a county-owned museum. Prior to being purchased by the Solmonssons, the

house had sat vacant. It was operated as a bed and

## Perry, Annable, Gross, Schiewe elected to Council

Incumbent Randy Schiewe and three newcomers were elected to the Baker City Council Tuesday.

Lynette Perry received the most votes — 2,293 among the 10 candidates for the four openings on the seven-member City Council.

Perry was elected to a fouryear term starting in Januarv, as were Carly Annable (1,462 votes) and Ken Gross (1,331 votes).

Schiewe, the lone incumbent on the ballot, received 1,204 votes and was elected to a two-year term.

## Walden wins

PORTLAND (AP) — Oregon state's lone Republican House member, Greg Walden in Eastern Oregon's 2nd District, has won re-election.

Walden's Democratic opponent, Jamie McLeod-Skinner, had staged a long-shot bid to unseat Walden.

## Gov. Kate Brown re-elected

Associated Press PORTLAND — Oregon Gov. Kate Brown was re-elected Tuesday, saying she won her first full term as leader of the Pacific Northwest state in a "slam-dunk."

Brown noted that several female candidates had won governorships in the Tuesday elections, and that Oregon voters had rejected a ballot measure to repeal the state's sanctuary status for immigrants.
